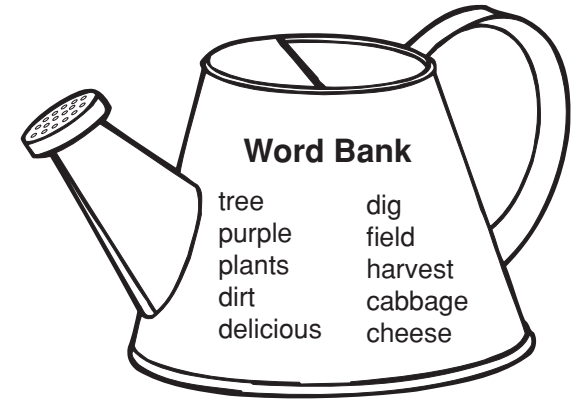


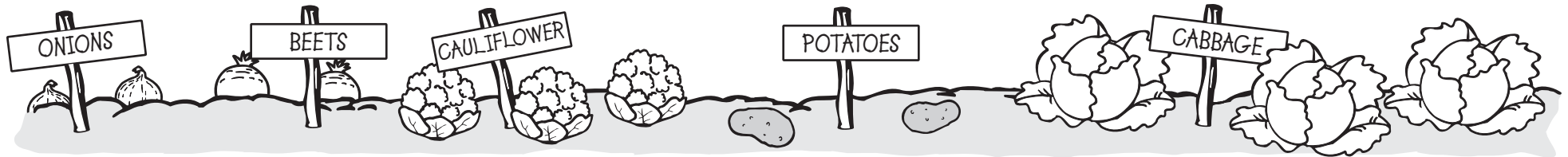
A Garden of Analogies
